Methodology



Method

Online survey among respondents 18 years of age or older.

(American Sample: n= 1,001).

Respondents had the option of completing the survey in English or in French and were randomly recruited using LEO's online panel.



When

November 24 to November 26, 2023



Margin of error

For comparison purposes, a probability sample of this size yields a margin of error no greater than ±3.1%, (19 times out of 20) for the American sample



Weighting

Results were weighted according to age, gender, region, education, ethnicity and number of people in the household in order to ensure a representative sample of the American population.



Methodology



Significant differences

Data in bold **red** characters indicate a significantly lower proportion than that of other respondents. Conversely, data in bold **green** characters indicate a significantly higher proportion that that of other respondents.



Rounded data

The numbers presented have been rounded up. However, the numbers before rounding were used to calculate the sums presented and might therefore not correspond to the manual addition of these numbers.

Methodology

Leger is the polling firm that has presented the most accurate election survey data, on average, over the last ten years in Canada. During the last federal election in 2021, Leger was once again **the most accurate firm in the country**. This accuracy is attributed to the quality of the LEO panel and rigorous application of methodological rules by Leger's 600 employees, including 200 professionals in Leger's eight offices across Canada (Montreal, Toronto, Quebec City, Winnipeg, Calgary, Edmonton and Vancouver) and in the United States (New York).

Key highlights



From November 24 to 26, 2023, we surveyed Canadians and Americans to know more about their beliefs in different conspiracy theories.

Some of the key highlights of our survey on conspiracy theories include...

- **84**% of U.S. residents believe in at least one of the theories they were exposed to, while Canadians are significantly less likely to believe in conspiracy theories.
- Republican voters (94%) are more likely to believe in at least one of the theories presented compared to Democratic and Independent voters.
- The most widely believed theories include:
 - Mainstream media manipulates the information it disseminates (63%)
 - COVID-19 was created as a biological weapon in a lab (51%)
 - Governments are hiding the truth about the harmfulness of vaccines from the public (49%)
- The less widely believed theories are the lunar landing being a hoax (17%) and the earth is flat (9%).






