

Methodology



Method

Online survey among respondents 18 years of age or older.

(U.S. sample: n= 1,000).

Respondents were randomly recruited using LEO's online panel.



When

March 23 to March 25, 2024



Margin of error

For comparison purposes, a probability sample of this size yields a margin of error no greater than ±3.1% (19 times out of 20).



Weighting

Results were weighted according to age, gender, region, education, ethnicity, and number of people in the household in order to ensure a representative sample of the American population.



Methodology



Significant differences

Data in bold **red** characters indicate a significantly lower proportion than that of other respondents. Conversely, data in bold **green** characters indicate a significantly higher proportion that that of other respondents.



Rounded data

The numbers presented have been rounded up. However, the numbers before rounding were used to calculate the sums presented and might therefore not correspond to the manual addition of these numbers.

Key Highlights (1/2)

Every month, we conduct a survey of U.S. residents to explore their views on the economy, finances, and the government. This month, our survey was conducted between March 23 and 25, 2024.

Some of the key highlights on the U.S. economy include...

- More than half (59%) of residents think the United States is currently in a recession, which is a three-point increase since last month.
- Four out of ten (40%) describe their household's finances as poor (28%) or very poor (12%).
- More than half (57%) say they are living paycheck to paycheck, an increase of 2 points compared to February 2024 (55%).
- Among those currently employed (41%) are concerned about losing their job in the next 12 months.





Key Highlights (2/2)

Some of the key highlights on U.S. politics include...

- Trump is taking the lead in voting intentions. If the Presidential election were to be held today, Trump would secure 48% of the votes, while Biden would secure 43%.
 - This is consistent with declining approval ratings for Biden, with greater than half of U.S residents disapproving of Joe Biden's job as president (53%), and only a third approving (31%).
- Donald Trump is still the preferred Republican candidate for president in 2024, receiving 79% of support from Republican voters, while his only rival still in the race, Nikki Haley, is preferred by 10% of the Republican voters.
 - Support for Trump has seen an increase of 4 points since February 2024.
- While only one-third of U.S. residents (31%) think that Donald Trump should be the Republican candidate if he is convicted and imprisoned, this rating is significantly stronger among republican voters (60%).
 - In fact, 69% of Republicans would vote for Donald Trump even if he were found guilty and imprisoned.
- One-third of U.S residents (33%) think the 2024 presidential elections will take place peacefully, while 67% think there will be disturbances, protests, and civil disobedience. Republicans are more likely to think the election will be peaceful (46%).






State of Household Finances - Trended














Concerns About Losing Job (1/3)




Concerns About Losing Job – *Trended*








Biden's Approval Rating – Evolution

% Approve presented




Preferred Republican Candidate






Choice of Running Mate for Donald Trump




Imprisonment of Donald Trump




Impact of Trump's Imprisonment on Republican Voters


